Lollipop Snowmen





<u>Here's what you will need to make these</u> <u>snowmen (see bag in pack)</u>

- •Lollipop stick
- Googly eyes
- Black marker
- •Orange marker
- Ribbon
- Buttons
- •Pipe cleaner
- •PVA glue (not provided)
- •Scissors (not provided)

Cut the pipe cleaner in half and wrap it around the top of lollipop stick and upwards to forms a spiral that makes the hat for the snowman.

Glue a pom pom to the end of the pipe cleaner and allow to dry.

Take the long piece of ribbon in half and glue to top of lollipop stick.

Attach googly eyes to the craft stick just below the hat.

Draw a carrot nose with orange marker.

Add dots with black marker to form a mouth.

Take the remainder of the pipe cleaner and wrap it around the lollipop stick to form a scarf that crosses in the front, just below the mouth. Secure in place with glue.

Glue three small buttons to the bottom portion of the snowman.

Accordion Reindeer





Here's what you will need to make two of this decoration (see bag in pack):

- Brown card/Cream card
- Googly eyes
- Pom pom
- Glue (not provided)
- Scissors (not provided)
- Template over leaf

Cut out shapes on template overleaf from the brown card/cream card.

Glue the ears and antlers onto the back of the reindeer's head.

Turn the head over and glue on some googly eyes and a red or black pom pom nose. Finish off your reindeer face with a happy smile.

To make this reindeer's body and tail we use a double accordion fold. It looks a bit tricky but honestly it is super simple.


Glue the two ends of your long body strips at right angles to each other. Fold the lower strip over the top of the upper strip. The upper strip is now the lower strip so fold that over the upper trip. Keep folding the strips over each other until you have used up all the strip of paper.

When you come to the end of the strips of paper, glue the two ends together and snip off any excess. You'll see that it is now a sort of spring that you can push flat or stretch out.

Glue the accordion folded reindeer's body between the two pairs of reindeer legs. Fold over the ends of the legs to make feet.

Repeat the accordion folding process with the little strips of paper to make the reindeer's tail and glue it into place.

Glue on the head and your reindeer is complete.



Upside Down Gingerbread Reindeer Cookies





Ingredients:

For Cookies: 350g plain flour 175g brown sugar 100g butter 1 egg 4 tablespoons golden syrup 1 teaspoon bread soda 2 teaspoons mixed spice For decorating: Icing sugar Cold water Chocolate (melted) Mini smarties or M&Ms

Method:

Put the flour, butter, mixed spice and bread soda in a mixing bowl. Mix it all together with fingertips until crumbly. Add sugar, golden syrup and egg. Mix until it forms a firm pastry mix. Using a rolling pin, roll out the pastry on a floured surface. Cut out cookies using a gingerbread man shape cookie cutter. Place cookies on a greased or non-stick baking tray. Bake for 15 minutes in a pre-heated oven at 180°C or Gas Mark 4 Remove from oven and cool on a wired tray.

To ice the reindeer, mix icing sugar with 1-2 tablespoons of cold water. Draw on the antlers, ears, etc. Use melted chocolate to make eyes and to attach mini smarties for noses.

Melting Snowman Cupcakes





Ingredients:

<u>For cupcakes:</u> 150g butter 150g caster sugar 160g self raising flour 15g cocoa 3 eggs 1 teaspoon vanilla essence

<u>For icing:</u> 50g butter 100g icing sugar

<u>To decorate:</u> Mini smarties or mini M&Ms Chocolate icing in tube Icing pens

To make cupcakes:

Line a 12-bun tray with paper cases.

Put all the cake ingredients in a bowl and beat together with either an electric mixer until light and creamy.

Divide the cake mixture between the paper cases.

Bake in a pre-heated over, 180°C or 350°F or Gas Mark 4, for 20 minutes or until risen and just firm to the touch. Transfer to a wire tray to cool.

To make icing:

Cream the butter, add the icing sugar a little at a time until creamy.

To decorate:

- 1. Decorate with buttercream icing and put a marshmallow on each cupcake.
- 2. Draw faces and arms using chocolate icing or icing pens, and make buttons out of the mini smarties. Draw on nose with orange icing pen.

This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger."


And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favours!"


But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart.



Christingle



What you'll need:

- Orange
- Red ribbon
- Sweets or dried fruit
- Cocktail sticks
- Tin foil
- Candle
- Sellotape
- Scissors
- Lighter/matches

How to make:

- 1 Using Sellotape fasten a piece of red ribbon around the centre of the orange.
- 2 Make hole in the top of the orange using a pair of scissors or a sharp pencil. You may need to get an adult to help you with this.
- 3 Cut a small section of tin foil and place this above the hole on the orange. This will be used to catch any hot wax.
- 4 Push a small cancel through the centre of the tin foil and into the hole.
- 5 Stick four cocktail sticks, with sweets and/or dried fruits on them, into the four sides of the orange. Make sure the sharp ends of the cocktail sticks are covered with something.
- 6 Light the candle.


Please be careful with the lit candle and should only be lit with adult supervision. If you have a battery-operated candle this could be used instead.

Meaning behind each piece of the Christingle:

Orange	Represents the whole world
Red Ribbon	Represents God's love wrapped around the world and the blood of Jesus shed on the cross.
Fruits/Sweets	Symbols of God's creations and can also represent the four seasons.
Lit Candle	Represents Jesus, light of the world, who brings hope to those living in darkness.

<u>Three-Legged Race</u>: Using string or rope, tie the inside legs of two family members and set up a race course for them to make their way through.



Once completed, try and write some other words in Morse Code.



Indoor Activities for Juniors: Lego Marble Run Challenge



Marble runs are all about being creative and finding clever ways of getting a marble to travel to the ground. What ways can you think of? Marble runs can be created almost anywhere. On walls, along tables, inside large carboard boxes or wherever else you can think of. Marble runs should be creative and imaginative – so try to think of clever ways to make your marble travel. They should also take the marble on a journey -so try and make sure it takes as long as possible for the marble to travel to the floor.

Use baseplates on a piece of wood leaned against a wall (make sure it is not too vertical) or baseplates at an angle on a table. Then start putting on brick to create a track for your marble to run down from the top to the bottom.

To make it more interesting how about including a spinner and arches that your marble has to travel through.

Marble runs need to be tested out as they are being made. One of the trickiest bits in making them is stopping the marble from flying off the ends of the tracks as it bounces down from one level to the next. You can experiment with making stoppers and buffers to prevent this from happening – it is all part of the problem-solving process!
