Easter Biscuits

Ingredients

300g plain flour 150g caster sugar 150g real block butter 1 large egg Few drops vanilla essence/extract (optional)

Method

- 1. Weigh the flour and sugar into a bowl. Add the butter and rub in until it looks like breadcrumbs with no big lumps of butter visible.
- 2. Beat the egg with vanilla then add to the bowl, gather together using knife and then use you hands to knead the biscuit dough together. Don't overwork the dough.
- 3. Shape into a disc cover with cling film and refrigerate for 20 minutes.
- 4. Heat the oven to 160*C fan/Gas 4, line to baking trays with parchment.
- 5. Dust the work surface with flour, have the dough and roll out to the thickness of a euro coin, cut out dough using shaped cutter or make your own cutter out of a thick piece of cardboard or tin foil. Place spaced out on tray.
- 6. Repeat the process with the rest of the dough. (I used a round cutter, an egg shape I made out of tinfoil, a gingerbread man cutter and then cut the arms off to make the bunny, and a knife to cut out the cross.)
- 7. Bake for 10-15 minutes until the biscuits are pale golden. Cool on the baking tray to firm up a little for 10 minutes then transfer to a wire rack.

Decorating

If you wish to decorate your biscuits, you can make icing as follows:

- 1. Add cold water to icing sugar to make a thick icing
- 2. Add some of this to a piping bag with small nozzle or use a small freezer bag and cut a small hole in the corner to make a homemade piping bag
- 3. Add food colourings to rest of icing in separate bowls and get creative!!

Easter Basket

Materials required:

16 Coloured Iollipop sticks
Card x 2 pieces
Pipe cleaner
Compass
Glue

Instructions:

1. From one piece of card cut two pieces of card measuring 5 cm x 17 cm.

Scissors

2. Take these two strips of card and over-lap the short ends by 1 cm and glue together.



- 3. On the other piece of card provided draw a circle 12 cm in diameter and then draw another circle in the middle of the first one 10 cm in diameter. Cut out the 12 cm circle. Now cut tabs in the outer of the circle to the inner circle.
- 4. Fold up the tabs around the circle. Glue the long strip around the circle using the tabs.





- 5. Overlap the other two ends by 1cm to make a tube and glue together. Allow to dry.
- 6. Take your coloured lollipop sticks and cut them all in half. Glue the lollipop sticks onto the card tube to make the outer of the basket.
- 7. Take your pipe cleaner and glue the ends inside the tube to make the handle of the basket (you may cut the pipe cleaner if you want a shorter handle).

Now your basket is ready for an easter egg hunt.

Face Cloth Bunny

Materials Required

Face cloth

Ribbon

Googly eyes

Pom pom

Clear hair bobbins

Glue



Instructions:

- 1. Fold the facecloth in half on a diagonal.
- 2. Starting at the of the triangle opposite the fold, roll up tight.



- 3. Fold the rolled-up facecloth in half.
- 4. Place a hair bobbin around the facecloth about half-way down.
- 5. Place another hair bobbin around the facecloth about half-way between the first hair bobbin and the pointed ends.
- 6. Tie a ribbon in a bow over the first hair bobbin, (this is the neck of the bunny).
- 7. Glue on googly eyes and pink pom pom (for nose) on the section between the two hair bobbins (this is the face of the bunny).
- 8. Adjust the ears any way you want.





Stained Glass Cross

Materials required

Cross template x 2
Tissue paper
Glue

Instructions

- 1. Cut out one cross template from the black card.
- 2. Cut the centre out of the cross template.
- 3. Cut the tissue paper into long strips.
- 4. Starting at the bottom, glue the black card of the cross at the bottom and sides of base and attach a strip of tissue paper across the bottom of the cross.
- Glue the next section of the cross and the top of the previous tissue strip and attach another strip of tissue paper across the cross. Repeat until you get to the middle of the cross.
- 6. Start the process again from the top of the cross until you get to the middle of the cross.
- 7. Then start the process again from one side of the cross with the tissue going from top to bottom on the arms of the cross. When you get to the middle just glue the edge of the last strip of tissue paper rather than the black of the cross.
- 8. Cut out the second cross template from the black card.
- 9. Glue onto the back of the other cross to secure all the tissue in place.
- 10. When completed and dried, stick up in a window to see the full effect of the stained glass.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Bring the game of tennis to your home with a simple but fun game of balloon tennis.

To set up your tennis court hang a blanket between two objects, such as chairs, for the net. Place markers (socks or tea towels) in the corners of your court so you roughly know the boundaries.



GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

Using items found in the garden, create an Easter garden to retell the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Fill a tray/plate with layer of soil. On one side on the tray/plate make a small mound with soil. Tie two twigs together to create a cross and stick this into the mound. This represents Jesus' crucifixion.

On the other side place a small flower pot or yoghurt pot to create the tomb. Infront of the tomb place a large stone. This represents the stone that sealed Jesus' body in the tomb and was found rolled away on Easter Sunday.

Create a small winding path from the tomb to the edge of the tray and then decorate the rest of the tray with leaves, grass and flowers such as daisies to help make it look colourful.

GETTING INTO THE ACTIVITY

The space outside where you live will be home to hundreds of bugs and creepy crawlies. Create a bug hotel for them to live in and help you keep an eye on which bugs are visiting.

To create your hotel, you'll need to cut off the bottom end of a drinks bottle. A grown-up will need to do this. Fill the bottle with long twigs, sticks, bark, leaves etc. Try to get them to run the length of the bottle and so they don't come out the end. If you can, try to cram the bottle with enough sticks, twigs etc, that they all stay in place if you give the bottle a little shake.

Lay the hotel in your garden or by your front door. Over the coming days, keep checking to see if any bugs are living in your bug hotel and try to keep a record of the different bugs that you see.

Instructions:

- There are 20 Pairs of cards in this Pack. You can use as many or as few Pairs as you like.
- You can have up to 4 Players (especially if you are using all the cards).
- 1. You could maybe start with 5 Pairs of cards, and then use more Pairs as your memory skills improve. Just make sure you always have Pairs!
- 2. Having selected the number of Pairs you are going to use, "shuffle" them to mix them up.
- 3. Players should work out among themselves who should go first (*this may be a disadvantage unless you are lucky to get a matching pair in your first go!*)
- 4. Place all the cards **FACE DOWN** on the floor or table, either in rows or randomly placed.
- 5. Players take turns to turn over a card and then try and turn over the "Matching" Card. If they match, the player keeps those cards. If they don't match, the Cards are turned face down again, and the next player has a go (*Everybody of course is trying to remember what card was turned up where before!*)
- 6. When all the cards are paired, the Winner is the person with the most Pairs.
- 7. Reshuffle cards well to play again.

Optional Rule:

Sometimes the game is played with a Rule that, if you get a matching Pair, you get another go. Whether or not to use that Rule will be up to the Players to decide, as a Group, before the game starts.

NB: You can also use the cards to play "SNAP"



Easter Bible Story

cloths. Then they took Him to a tomb to bury Him.





He wondered if it could possibly be true. Did Jesus really raise from the dead? Was Jesus really alive?


